


Millions of lives changed in India

India is the second most populous country in the world, with more than 1.39 billion citizens.

The scale of need in India is immense, making India the concentrated center of the global water and sanitation crisis.

Since 2005, Water.org has played a significant role in India's progress toward improved water and sanitation, empowering more than 14 million people to date with access to safe water and sanitation.

By partnering with different types of organizations, including microfinance institutions, self-help group federations, state rural livelihoods missions, commercial banks, social enterprises and the government of India, we are increasing access to safe water and improved sanitation for families in need across the country.





COVID-19 underscores the importance of access to safe water

In mid-2020, women in Balarampur village in India stand in pre-marked circles, six feet apart, waiting to fill their vessels with water. A lack of access to safe water at home is now more life threatening than ever. Risking exposure to COVID-19, women leave their homes and walk to these kiosks each day to get the water their families need to survive.

Because of your continued support, two of these women now have access to safe water at home — empowering them to safeguard their families from COVID-19 and other health issues. They join the other 14 million people we have reached in India who now have access to safe water, sanitation, and the health and resilience they bring.

Together we can give more people in need the opportunity for improved health. And it starts with access to safe water.

Meet Equity Bank in Kenya

One of our financial partners in Kenya — Equity Bank — has a team dedicated solely to lending for water and sanitation. They offer small loans for household water and sanitation improvements, such as rain storage tanks that allow families to capture and store water during the rainy season and use it long after the season ends.

The team at Equity Bank shares our vision of safe water and sanitation for all. They have seen firsthand the unique challenges and opportunities in their communities. They understand how when they lend to their customers for household water and sanitation solutions, these families experience improved health, time for education, and income generation.

Together with our partners around the world, like Equity Bank, we helped mobilize \$567 million in capital in 2020 to support small loans that brought safe water and sanitation to people in need.




Driving impact during the COVID-19 pandemic


